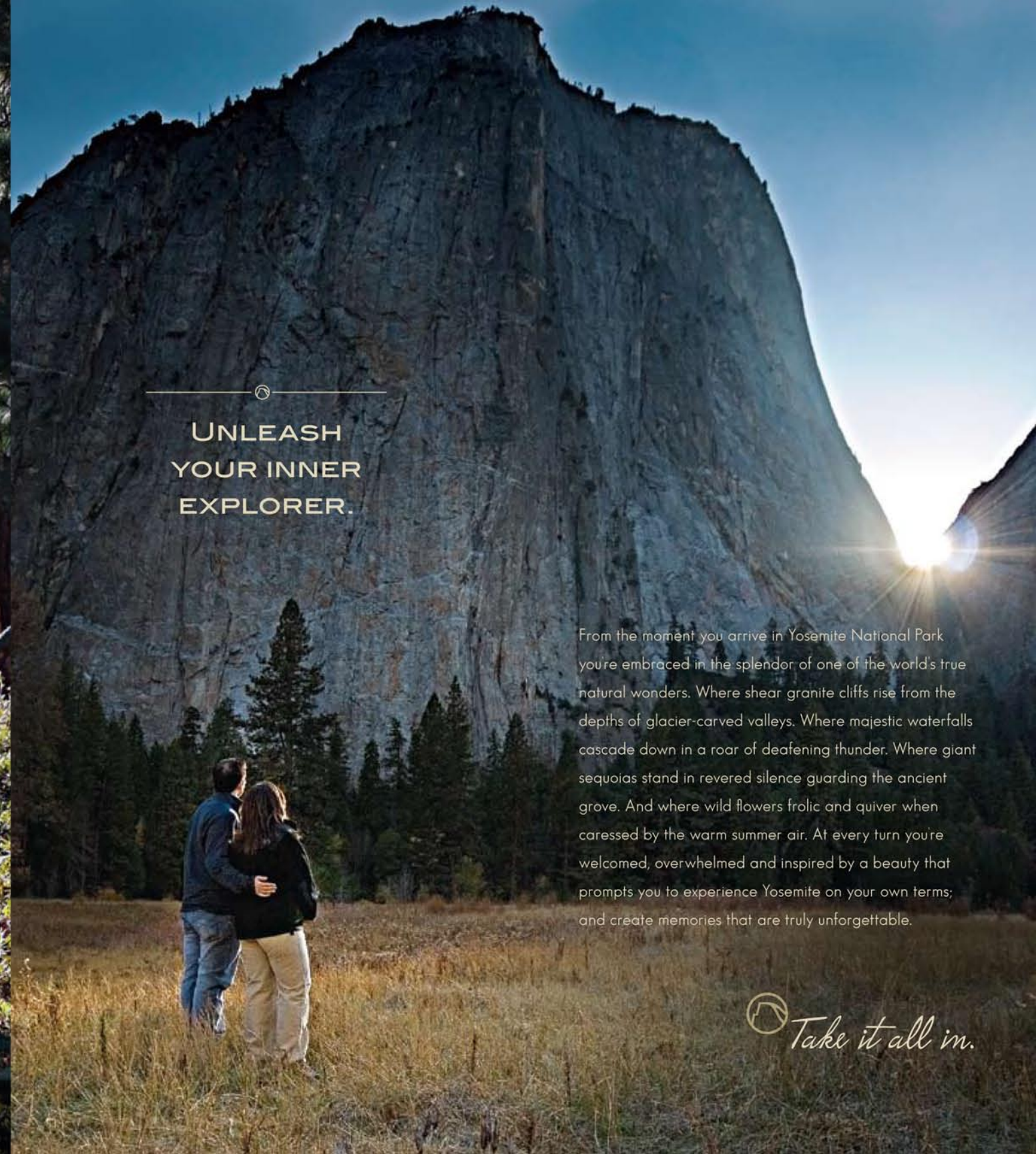

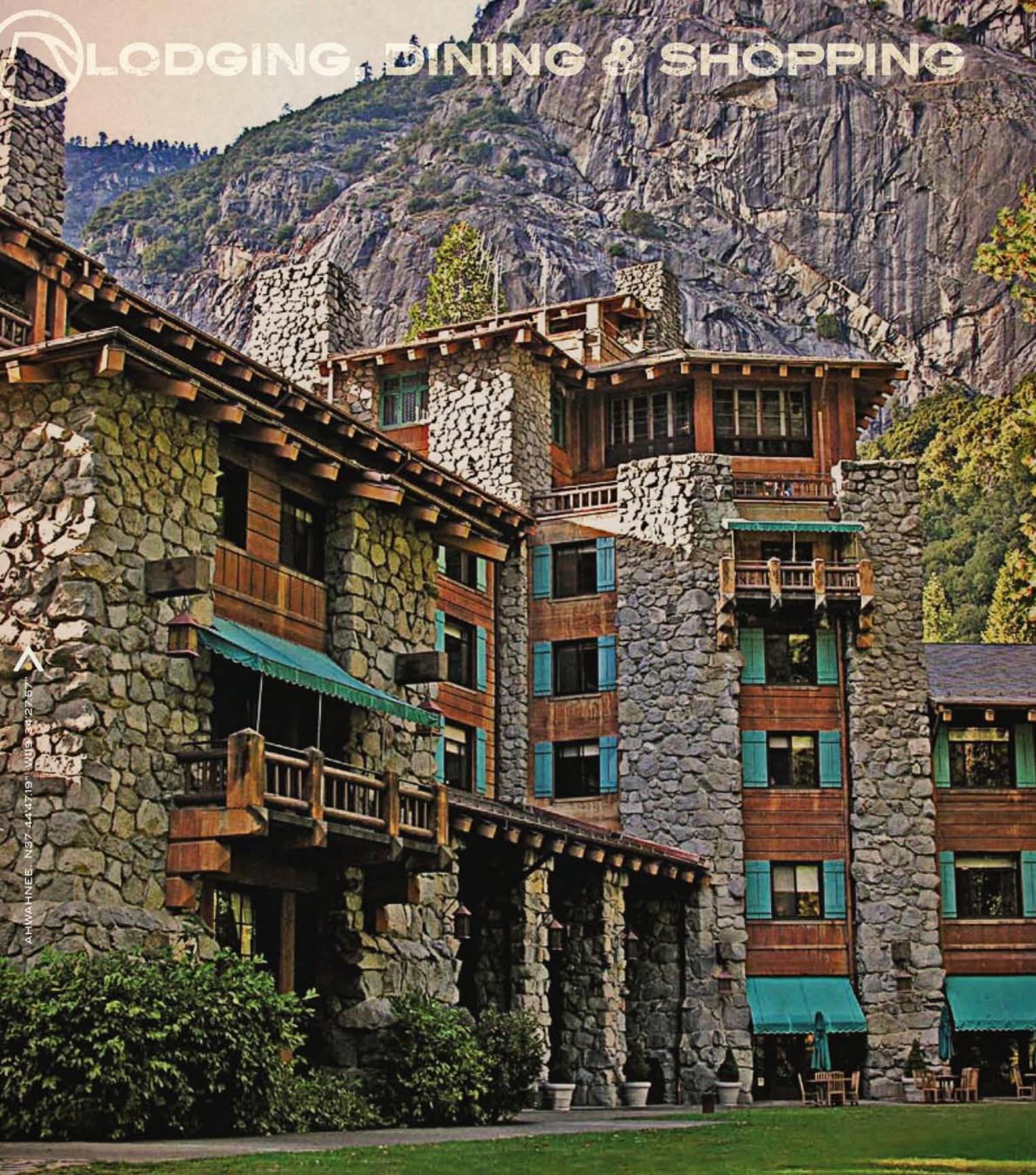

## Badger Pass Ski Area

A Yosemite tradition since 1935, Badger Pass offers downhill skiing, snowboarding and tubing for enthusiasts of all skill levels in a family-friendly atmosphere. Badger Pass Ski School provides the perfect place to learn a new winter activity with individual and group lessons.

## Snowshoeing

Explore the winter Yosemite landscape on snowshoes and experience the Park like never before. An easy, low-impact way to get around, snowshoe rentals are readily available from three different locations within Yosemite.

## Cross-Country Skiing

Whether it's an overnight trek to Glacier Point or just a day exploring the Park, cross-country skiing is a fun way to discover Yosemite in winter. Plus everything you need from rentals to lessons are available at the Badger Pass Cross-Country Ski Center.

## Ice Skating

Since the 1930's, the Ice Rink at Curry Village has been an ideal setting for winter recreation. Add the warmth of the outdoor fire ring, and you've got a perfect gathering place to share stories, roast s'mores or just enjoy the natural beauty of Yosemite.

**Insider's Tip:** Due to its size, weather patterns can vary greatly and change quickly in different areas of Yosemite. Be prepared for sudden weather changes and check the forecast before heading out.
